



Dr. Sena Dei-Tutu is a lawyer with a strong grasp of rule of law, governance, gender and development issues. She has over 18 years experience in the fields of rule of law, gender justice and security sector reform in international and post conflict settings.

Until August 2015, Dr. Dei-Tutu worked as a Judicial System Advisor and Legal Trainer with the United Nations Mission in Liberia. For over 8 years she worked in different capacities with the United Nations Mission in Liberia. As legal officer in Charge of Training for the Rule of Law Division and also as Judicial Systems Advisor, she worked in close collaboration with national rule of law counterparts in developing policy and strategy options for the consolidation of a national framework and also helped establish a level of functionality in the legal and justice system in post-Conflict Liberia.

In August 2015, Dr. Dei-Tutu moved to the University of Ghana Law School, to serve as a lecturer. She lectures in the Law of Contract, Public International Law and Gender and the Law.

She is also an adjunct lecturer at the Kofi Annan International Peace Keeping Centre, where she teaches courses on International law, Conflict Peace and Security and Gender.

She is currently on sabbatical from the University working as the Senior Rule of Law Advisor to the African Union Technical Support Team to the Gambia. At the behest of the African Union she is working with the Gambia government in re-structuring the rule of law agencies and offering advice on Security Sector reform in the Gambia post Yaya Jammeh (A dictator who ruled Gambia for 23 years).

She will return to lecturing at the University of Ghana in the New Year.
